'Prepare the way of the Lord,
make his paths straight.'"

⁴Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region



along the Jordan, ⁶and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.



Then he consented. ¹⁶And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. ¹⁷And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

This morning the council members stand ready to offer you a blessing and to pray with you.


If you wish to receive a blessing, hold out your hands to the council member at the end of your communion line and they will bless you with oil.


